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## **Donor Bill of Rights**

2. To expect that KGHF, its board, staff and volunteers, are accountable to its donors.
3. To know that every dollar donated to KGHF will go toward its intended purpose.
4. To be informed of the identity of those serving the organization including those serving on the governing board, compensated staff or volunteers.
5. To expect the governing board to exercise prudent judgment in its stewardship responsibilities.
6. To have access to the organization's most recent financial statements.
7. To receive appropriate acknowledgment and recognition.
8. To be assured that information about their donations is handled with respect and with confidentiality, as allowed by law.
9. To have the opportunity for their name to be deleted from mailing lists or any public recognition program.
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
