Seeing the Big Picture

Cascadia Community Care Alliance is a program for Medicare beneficiaries. Cascadia CCA is led by providers and centers on primary care. This means we focus on keeping people well, not layering on tests and treatments once they're sick.

Benefits For Patients

Cascadia CCA helps patients get the right care, in the right place and at the right time. Seeing providers that are part of the program means you have more support. This may include:

- Working with a care manager who tracks your visits, recommends next steps and removes barriers such as missing referrals or forms.
- Getting home health services even if you're not fully homebound.
- Going to a nursing home without first having a three-night hospital stay.
- Getting priority scheduling for in-person visits.
- Seeing a mental health provider at the same clinic where you get primary care.
- Joining PeaceHealth's <u>Flourish program</u> without a fee. Flourish helps you manage chronic health conditions. Cascadia CCA covers the cost for you.

Gerry's Story

Living by herself, Gerry knew it would be a few days before her visiting caregiver would be back. After she had fallen and was still feeling weak, she thought it best to seek care at the emergency room.

Finding nothing wrong, the providers couldn't admit her to the hospital. But they also didn't feel it was safe for her to be home alone.

Fortunately, Gerry was part of Cascadia Community Care Alliance. A care manager swiftly worked to find another option. Gerry was able to go to a skilled nursing facility until she felt strong enough to return home.


Gerry's story is just one of many examples of how CCCA helps patients get the right care for their needs — quickly and safely.

Provider-Led Program


Most Cascadia CCA board members (75%) are providers. The board also includes two patient representatives. These leaders bring their insights as a care team into their oversight of the program.

Cascadia CCA History

Cascadia CCA launched in 2021. As the program grows, we are on pace to serve more than 30,000 patients. The care team involved in Cascadia CCA includes PeaceHealth, community providers, skilled nursing homes and home health agencies. Our partners must meet national standards for high quality care to be part of Cascadia CCA. You may hear Cascadia CCA called an "accountable care organization" (ACO). This means we are part of a national effort to improve healthcare through new approaches and tools. Cascadia CCA is one of the first programs to offer Medicare services this way.

Quality Measures Performance

Medicare tracks quality by looking at hospital readmissions, unplanned admissions, and timely follow-up after flare-ups of chronic conditions. In the second performance year we achieved the following results:

- ACR score = 13.97
 - Ranked 3rd out of 99 ACO REACH programs
- UAMCC score = 30.80
 - In the top third of all ACO REACH programs

ACR: Risk-Standardized, All-Condition Readmission UAMCC: Risk-Standardized, All-Cause Unplanned Admissions for Patients with Multiple Chronic Conditions

Shared Savings Information

One of the goals of the ACO REACH program is to enhance care for patients while reducing costs.

With our help, Medicare saved almost 14 million dollars (compared to expected spending) in calendar year 2022 for our Cascadia CCA patients.

This put Cascadia CCA in the top 30% of ACO REACH programs (when measured by cost per patient).

As shown above, this was done while maintaining and, in some cases, increasing the quality of care.

Medicare rewards good work like this by sharing about half the savings. We received a net total of \$6,847,344.

We are investing 36% of that amount into care infrastructure, redesigning care processes and other resources. This will help us continue to enhance quality, improve outcomes and further reduce Medicare costs for beneficiaries.

Our participating provider groups received a portion of the remaining 64%, according to the Cascadia CCA Shared Savings Distribution Policy.
