#### **Excellence in action**

Research & Publications

Notable research projects underway:

- "High-Flow Oxygen and Dysphagia: Challenging Assumptions and Rethinking Bedside Management" by Lindsey Greathouse and Tyler Niesen. This study explores the impact of high-flow oxygen therapy on patients with trouble swallowing (dysphagia), challenging existing assumptions and proposing new bedside management strategies.
- "Nurse Tech to Resident Confidence and Competence" by Angela Lochridge, Tork Rosenvinge, Laken Budge and Tyler Niesen. Data is being collected to better understand how nurse tech programs affect the confidence and competence of new graduate nurses.

Notable publications that have made significant contributions to nursing practice:

- "The Relationship between a Professional Nurse Advancement Program and Nurse Retention: A Correlational Study," by Melissa Laitsch, Terra Merwin, Keila Torres, Jeffrey Coto, Jake McGuire, Roseanna Bell. Published in Nurse Leader in October 2024, this study showed that the PNAP program strongly influenced nurse retention.
- "Evidence-Based Practice Project to Decrease Falls Through Implementation of a Nurse-Driven Mobility Program," by Danielle Jordahl, Melissa Laitsch, Jeffery Coto, Franak Variava, Erin Suda, and Sadie Rabener Justice. Published in MedSurg Nursing in October 2024, this study showed that a nurse-implemented tool resulted in better patient mobilization with less risk of harm.

"The Nurse Tech position helped me get familiar with all the different med surg units throughout the hospital, meet a lot of wonderful nurses, and get comfortable with medication administration. I am very thankful for all the practice and experience this position offered me." – Liam O.





#### **Annual Fall Research Showcase**

Organized by the Nursing Professional Governance Research and Innovation Council, the event highlights innovation, research, quality improvement and evidence-based projects that impact patient outcomes. It featured 100 attendees, nine speakers, six art submissions and 32 posters.



#### **Innovation**

PeaceHealth's commitment to nursing innovation has been exemplified through several impactful projects and initiatives:

- Wound care rovers: Introduction of handheld mobile devices to enhance wound care management and decrease time needed for specialized wound treatment.
- Signs supporting language equity: The addition of visual signs to help ensure all patients have equal access to a safe, welcoming environment when they receive care in the Childbirth Center.
- Mental health support resources flyer: Providing patients in our emergency departments a list of local mental health resources and support options.
- Walking markers: Installation of decals to measure walking distance and increase patient mobility. The results show patients are walking farther more often. Expansion to other units is planned.

"After attending the conference, I'm motivated to deepen my knowledge of pediatric pharmacology. I'm also interested in learning more about behavioral and psychological techniques to ease pediatric patients' anxiety, as well as how to better involve families in the perioperative." – Corey L.
