Established in 1943, PeaceHealth St. John Medical Center, alongside clinics in Longview and Kelso, serves as a vital healthcare hub in Cowlitz County, Washington. PeaceHealth St. John is the community's sole hospital and a Level III trauma center. The medical center offers extensive specialized services and programs, including an exceptional cancer care program, complemented by family medicine and primary care clinics, all contributing to the local community's well-being.

Service Area

Cowlitz County is located on the Columbia River in southern Washington. Longview is home to over 35% of the county's residents, followed by Kelso with approximately 11%.

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
