Thank you for your interest in PeaceHealth! An important part of our [Mission](#) is to treat each person in a loving and caring way. In that spirit, we want to make sure you know that PeaceHealth has become aware of a scam involving false job offers. The parties involved have used PeaceHealth's name, logo, and even current employee names in their scams. These scams may appear genuine at first; however, there are some warning signs. They include:

- Employment interviews and job offers based solely on questionnaires.
- Interviews done via an on-line service such as Google Hangouts, Yahoo Instant Messenger, or a similar service.
- Requiring payment (or pre-payment) for visa applications or processing services.
- Employment offers over social media, such as Facebook.
- An offer that seems too good to be true.
- You have not formally applied for a job at PeaceHealth through our official [Careers](#) site.
- The job offer comes immediately after a quick telephone or instant message interview.
- Email messages contain spelling, grammatical and punctuation mistakes.
- You are asked to provide confidential information or to complete a "credit report form."

Please be aware that PeaceHealth will never contact you about a job for which you have not applied. We do not ask job applicants to pay an upfront fee for the application process. And we never interview job applicants via an on-line service.
